

## Applying for Levels of Care Certification

*October 2022*

This document outlines contents for a new Level of Care certification application. This document is an update from the original application instructions released in April 2018.

If you are looking to maintain certification, please complete separate instructions that were sent in the email to maintain certification.

If you are applying for a new Level of Care, please submit all the application components in a single PDF document with the following instructions:

- Standards US letter paper size (8.5" x 11")
- Font size that is 11 points or larger. Smaller text in figures, graphs, or charts is generally acceptable as long as the text is legible when the page is viewed at 100%.
- Margins that at least measure at least 0.5 inch (top, bottom, and sides) on pages
- Please provide original supporting documents as well as new level supporting documents  
**\*previously submitted documentation is required**

*Levels of Care for Baltimore City Hospitals Responding to the Opioid Epidemic*

Level of Care	Action
<p><i>A Level 3 hospital:</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Screens emergency department patients for at-risk substance use and substance use disorder</li> <li>2) Has an emergency department discharge protocol (as required by state law) that includes a referral to community-based treatment for patients with substance use disorder</li> <li>3) Prescribes naloxone to emergency patients at high risk for opioid overdose</li> <li>4) Maintains capacity to initiate treatment for opioid use disorder for emergency department patients</li> <li>5) Promulgates guidelines for judicious prescribing of opioid analgesics across the hospital system</li> <li>6) Provides information about safe storage and disposal to patients who are prescribed opioids</li> </ul>
<p><i>A Level 2 hospital meets the criteria of Level 3 and:</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>7) Offers peer recovery specialist services or similar support services to emergency department patients</li> <li>8) Screens directly admitted patients for at-risk substance use and substance use disorder</li> <li>9) Prescribes naloxone to admitted patients at high risk for opioid overdose</li> <li>10) Maintains capacity to initiate treatment for opioid use disorder for admitted patients</li> <li>11) Monitors fidelity to prescribing guidelines and addresses cases of injudicious prescribing</li> </ul>

<p><i>A <b>Level 1</b> hospital meets the criteria of Levels 3 and 2 and:</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>12) Maintains capacity to initiate treatment for opioid use disorder for admitted patients with at least one formulation of each medication approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for that purpose</li><li>13) Offers peer recovery support services or similar support services to admitted patients</li><li>14) Dispenses naloxone to emergency department patients and admitted patients at high risk for opioid overdose</li><li>15) Screens patients in hospital campus outpatient clinics for at-risk substance use and substance use disorder</li><li>16) Offers ongoing treatment in appropriate hospital campus outpatient clinics, including clinics that do not specialize in the treatment of substance use disorder</li></ul>
